#### **Opening**

The meeting of the Department Chairs' Council was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by the Associate Provost Brown-Guillory.

#### A. Opening

Associate Provost Brown-Guillory asked if there were any corrections to the minutes. Dr.
Boutte-Queen stated that she was absent but was represented by Ms. Doraine Slaughter. Dr.
Saldivar corrected her name and made a motion to accept the minutes. Dr. Iqbal seconded.

#### B. Announcements

- Dr. Campbell inquired if there was an appropriate protocol regarding the death of Joshua McMackle. She wanted to know if the department was to send out a letter to the students. Dr. Brown-Guillory advised that a candlelight vigil is being held and that Dr. Saunders, Vice President and Dean of Students, would be the person to contact with questions about University protocol regarding student affairs. Dr. Green mentioned that Assistant Chief Dirden has requested students to come forth with any information about the incident and forward email to Dr. Saunders.
- Dr. Saldivar mentioned that a book review will be held Wednesday in MLK 111 from noon to 1:00 p.m., the subject of discussion will be Ralph Waldo Emerson.
- Dr. Boutte-Queen mentioned that the Department of Social Work and the Department of Administration of Justice will host an Innocence Project Forum on Friday.
- Dr. Broussard mentioned that there will be a hooding ceremony for the Department of Counseling, and that she will forward the information to the Council.
- Dr. Clay mentioned that the Department of Psychology is sponsoring a recruitment event for the University of Michigan on Thursday, April 22, at noon.

### C. Transfer Policy

• Dr. Brown-Guillory mentioned that the Provost was in the process of impaneling a Transfer Council and asked for input on what policies should be established by the new Council dealing with transfer policies.

#### D. Dean Search

• Dr. Brown-Guillory announced that the Provost wants feedback from all faculty, staff, and students who will be meeting with dean candidates for the College of Liberal Arts and Behavioral Sciences, the Thurgood Marshall School of Law, and the Assistant Provost for Online and Distance Learning Programs and Dean of the College of Continuing Education. She mentioned that there will be at least 12 opportunities to meet with candidates. The search process began in November 2009 and will hopefully conclude in late May or early June.

## E. Faculty Awards Luncheon

- Dr. Brown-Guillory reminded the Council of the upcoming Faculty Awards Luncheon and asked
  them to send in a head count of faculty who will be in attendance. She also asked that all
  nominees and winners for college level awards be sent to her. She recommended that faculty who
  didn't apply this year should start the application process early for next year since the standards
  will remain and only the deadline date will change.
- Dr. Nwagwu asked about the number of college-level awards for faculty awards; he wanted to know if there were separate awards for teaching and research. Dr. Brown-Guillory stated that the

Provost asked deans to set up awards and to make them available in teaching, research/creative activity and service.

#### F. Promotion and Tenure

Dr. Brown-Guillory noted that promotion and tenure standards were pulled down from the
website until the processes were approved for the Faculty Manual, which should go before the
Board of Regents in Fall 2010.

## G. University Curriculum Council

Dr. Brown-Guillory informed the Council that Dr. Ohia renamed the University Curriculum
Committee to University Curriculum Council and that it is now reinvigorated and meets every 3<sup>rd</sup>
Wednesday from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. She mentioned that there are faculty members who are
not showing up for UCC meetings and advised that participation is needed as decisions are being
made that are germane to the University.

#### H. International Travel

- Dr. Brown-Guillory stated that Provost Ohia has established a policy regarding international travel. A request to travel internationally must be submitted to Provost's Business Services 60 days prior to travel.
- Dr. Brown Guillory announced that she intends to focus on advisement at the next meeting. She
  discussed the possibility of additional staff advisors, a recommendation made to the Provost by
  the Retention Committee, which met weekly for eight months to discuss how best to improve our
  retention rate.

## I. International Study Abroad

 Dr. Brown-Guillory noted that Dr. Maddox reported that approximately 110 students have studied abroad since 1997. She announced that she would like input from the Council about how to structure study abroad so that TSU might increase opportunities for students and faculty to study abroad.

Dr. Brown-Guillory adjourned the meeting at 5:00 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for September 13, 2010 at 4:00 p.m., in Hannah Hall, Conference Room 111.
