Opening

The meeting of the Department Chairs' Council was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Associate Provost Brown-Guillory. She moved that the minutes from the previous meeting be approved. Dr. Sarah G. Trotty motioned to approve the minutes; it was seconded by Dr. Ihekwoaba Onwudiwe.

A. Faculty Manual Committee Updates

• Dr. Michael Adams, Chair of the Faculty Manual Committee, spoke to the council regarding recent developments in updating the faculty manual. Dr. Brown-Guillory said that once there is a complete iteration it will be placed on the Faculty Senate website for all to review. It will then be voted on during Fall Opening Faculty Meeting.

B. University Curriculum Council

Drs. Aladdin Sleem and Jafus Cavil, UCC Chair and Vice Chair respectively, updated the council on the correct routing process for all curriculum modifications. All forms are now available for downloading on the UCC website. Dr. Cavil outlined the process for form submission, stating that completed forms should be forwarded to the UCC via email. Once received, all curriculum proposals will be routed the same way: The proposal is submitted to and reviewed by the UCC members in a formal presentation at the next scheduled meeting. Once approved at the UCC level, the proposals are sent to Dr. Brown-Guillory for approval and uploading to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board where, upon approval, the changes are added to Banner and the University Catalog. Dr. Sleem added that because of problems in the past that he and Dr. Cavil would soon implement an automated tracking system but for now all forms would be tracked manually with a special tracking ID number. The new tracking system will also insure that proper signatures are maintained during the whole process so that course offerings remain consistent with the database. Dr. Sleem asked the council to refrain from announcing any curriculum changes to students before the proposals have been confirmed. Dr. Brown-Guillory reminded the council that the deadline to submit proposals to be reviewed during the May UCC meeting is April 25th.

C. Undergrad Program Review

• Dr. Brown-Guillory announced to the council that the university had successfully completed two program reviews of the English and Mathematics departments. The university's current review schedule is for 28 programs to be reviewed over seven years, with seven programs coming up for review in Fall 2012. She said that the review schedule will be made available via the Division of Academic Affairs and Research website. Dr. Brown-Guillory said that in May the provost will meet with the deans of the two previously reviewed departments to go over the external reviewers reports and to plan a timeline for suggested improvements.

D. Teaching Evaluations

• Dr. Brown-Guillory reported that the Ad Hoc Faculty Performance and Teaching Evaluations Committee had designed an instrument which will be taken to the deans at the next meeting of the Executive Leadership Council for review. She said that from there the deans will take the forms to their faculty for further review. Dr. Brown-Guillory added that President Rudley would like all evaluations up and running by Fall 2012 and that the new software will also be able to generate comparative studies. She said by then the university should have used up all remaining hard copies in anticipation of the new online system. Dr. Claudette Ligons stated that student committee members had promised to market the new evaluations through the Student Government Association to help motivate the student body to participate in evaluations.

E. Faculty Awards Luncheon

• Dr. Brown-Guillory thanked everyone for their participation in the luncheon and asked that faculty continue to support the awards by submitting applications and encouraging their colleagues to do so as well.

F. May Commencement Updates

• Dr. Brown-Guillory informed the council that the recipient of the honorary degree would be Mr. Harry E. Johnson, Sr., President and CEO of the Washington, DC Martin Luther King, Jr. National Memorial Project Foundation. Mr. Johnson will also deliver the commencement address.

G. Deluxe Theatre Updates

• Dr. Brown-Guillory informed the council that the said the contracts between TSU and the City of Houston had been signed so that now the plans for renovations on the historic Fifth Ward building could commence. She said that the city is providing \$3 million for the extensive renovation project. Dr. Brown-Guillory stated that because the project is a joint venture between the City of Houston and TSU that there would be extensive community involvement.

H. THECB

• Dr. Brown-Guillory informed the council of her recent trip to Austin to build relationships with top THECB officials. She said that while the meeting was informative, her priority was to assure them that TSU's processes would be in line with those of the THECB.

Adjournment:

Dr. Christian Ulasi moved to adjourn the meeting, and it was seconded by Dr. Rhonda Saldivar. The meeting was adjourned at 5:00 pm. The next meeting of the Department Chairs' Council is scheduled for Monday, June 4, 2012 at 4:00pm in the Hannah Hall Conference Room 111.
