#### **Opening**

The meeting of the Department Chairs' Council was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Associate Provost Brown-Guillory. She moved that the minutes from the previous meeting be approved. Dr. Haiqing Sun motioned to approve the minutes; it was seconded by Dr. Roger Hart.

#### A. Report from the Faculty Senate

- Dr. Jafus Cavil, Secretary of the Faculty Senate, updated the council on key items concerning faculty. He said the updates to the Faculty Manual were ongoing.
- Dr. Rasoul Saneifard, Faculty Senate Chair, added that several students have reported that a lack of effective customer service, across all levels, from faculty to administrators to staff, was a major issue. He urged council members to remember that customer service is part of the University's push for improved recruitment and retention, and that they should endeavor to put students first.

# B. Fall Opening Faculty Meeting/Collegiality Panel

• Dr. Brown-Guillory spoke about the great success of the panel on collegiality. She said that over eighty faculty talked for two and a half hours concerning this topic. Dr. Brown-Guillory said that because of this panel's success her office would be recording each panel member's 3 minute talk. She said the video would be made available online on the Academic Affairs website. She said executive summaries of the talks would also be made available.

### C. Report from the Catalog Revision Executive Committee

• Dr. Jafus Cavil, UCC Vice Chair & Co-Chair of the Catalog Revision Executive Committee, spoke to the council concerning the process for online catalog revisions. He informed the council that the committee is currently exploring different software options that would allow live updates to the online catalog, instead of redoing the entire catalog as is the current practice.

#### D. Report from the University General Education Subcommittee

• Dr. Aladdin Sleem, Chair of the University Curriculum Council and Co-Chair of the University General Education Subcommittee, addressed the council concerning changes to the core. He said those changes would be approved very soon and would need to be reported to the THECB in November 2013.

# E. Questions from the Associate and Assistant Deans' Council

• Dr. Brown-Guillory spoke to the council about Dr. Maurice Mangum's question concerning allowing graduating seniors to apply for graduation the semester before they are due to graduate. Dr. Brown-Guillory mentioned that she'd called University Registrar Mrs. Marilynn Square to ask if changing the deadline for graduation applications could be done, and she said Mrs. Square had agreed. She said the new suggested dates for May commencement would be a November 4<sup>th</sup> deadline for priority applications and a final deadline of February 7<sup>th</sup> deadline for all applicants. Dr. Brown-Guillory said she would take recommendations to the deans and Provost Ohia.

#### F. Promotion and Tenure Workshop

• Dr. Brown-Guillory reminded the council of TLEC's Promotion and Tenure Workshop to be held Thursday, September 12, from noon to 1:30 p.m. in the Honors College. She said that she, Dr. Oscar Criner, Dr. Robert Bullard, Dr. Gregory Maddox and Provost Ohia would serve on the panel again. She added that this workshop would feature a new section for department chairs to encourage the writing of more substantive letters concerning the applicants' candidacy for promotion and/or tenure. Dr. Brown-Guillory said that during the current Promotion and Tenure cycle, administration would like for all involved (promotion and tenure committee members, chairs and deans) to better evaluate candidates by taking a closer look at the full dossier.

#### G. Offer Letter Process (RMO)

• Dr. Brown-Guillory reminded council members that all offers of employment must be preceded by a Request to Make an Offer (RMO) form. She said that Dr. Ohia has requested to see this detail before any offer letters are forwarded to his office. Dr. Brown-Guillory also mentioned that some departmental faculty had complained that they had not been informed of the offers beforehand as well. She asked council members to make a concerted effort to urge their faculty to attend presentations of job candidates and to submit input in the process.

# H. Drop Policy

• Dr. Brown-Guillory said that the policy was ready for approval by deans and that it would be on the agenda for their next meeting.

#### I. Academic Standing Policy

• Dr. Brown-Guillory informed the council that the new policy had been approved by the deans and provost. She said Dr. Ohia would send the document to President Rudley and once approved would go into effect immediately.

# J. Proposed Policy on Override Privileges

• Dr. Brown-Guillory said that the policy would go before deans for approval at their next meeting. She added that according to the new policy, if any unauthorized overrides occur, that person will have his/her privileges revoked. Dr. Brown-Guillory stressed that only deans and their designees will be allowed to make overrides for courses offered through their colleges/schools..

# K. Founders Day/Fall Convocation (regalia re-instituted)

• Dr. Brown-Guillory informed the council that due to budgetary concerns, Founders Day and Convocation would be joined into one ceremony this year. She said that when this decision was made, some deans felt strongly that faculty should go back to wearing regalia as they once did at convocation. Dr. Brown-Guillory said that faculty with classes during 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. were encouraged to bring their classes. She added that the event would also honor the retirement of Dr. Thomas F. Freeman.

## Adjournment:

Dr. Christian Ulasi moved to adjourn the meeting, and it was seconded by Dr. Jason Oby. The meeting was adjourned at 5:00 pm. The next meeting of the Department Chairs' Council is scheduled for Monday, October 21, 2013 at 4:00pm in the Hannah Hall Conference Room 111.
