Developing a Mission Statement Institutional Assessment, Planning, and Effectiveness Texas Southern University

A Mission Statement is a brief statement that describes the general values and principles that guide a unit/department. It should set the tone for the department/unit and communicate the overall purpose. The mission statement should align with the university's goals and mission.

A mission statement must answer four important questions: who are we, what do we do, why do we do it, and for whom do we do it?

- Who are we is simply stating the name of your unit/department.
- What do we do includes a description of the unit/department's most primary functions or activities.
- Why we do it describes the reasons why you perform major functions or activities. Describe the purpose of the unit/department.
- For whom do we do it describes stakeholders, who are people that will benefit for your unit/department.

Mission Statement

The mission of <the name of your unit/department> is to <your primary purpose(s)> by providing <your major functions or activities> to <your stakeholders>.

Example: The University Academic Advising Center is dedicated to providing students with access to proactive advisers who serve as guides throughout the exploration process, collaborating with students so they may develop as citizens and realize their academic and life goals.
