Workshop Descriptions

Best Practices for Teaching with Nearpod: Faculty will learn some effective strategies for engaging students through the Nearpod platform. Nearpod is an interactive program that allows instructors to easily insert videos, activities and assessments into the lecture slides.

Scholarly Writing Workshop and Retreat: Faculty participating in this event on Friday will attend a full-day series of workshops with experts to learn the basics for writing grants and publications. The sessions will include: *How to develop research questions- How to write grants and publications- How to form collaborations*. The following Saturday will be devoted to applying the skills learned in the Scholarly Writing Workshop. Faculty will have the opportunity to further develop their research and complete their projects without the distraction of work.

Student Wellness- How to support your students outside the classroom: Often faculty are at a loss of what to do when they encounter students who struggle with personal challenges. In this workshop, participants will learn about the student support resources available on campus and some strategies for handling difficult situations.

Promotion and Tenure Informational: Participants will learn about promotion and tenure in the College and direct questions to panel of senior faculty about the process. The panelists will share their experiences and wisdom for attaining promotion and tenure.

TSU Research Week Symposium: The CCE participants will have the opportunity to participate in a full day workshop and share their progress on their project with their mentor. Session topics will include: *Leaders developing leaders (CCE progress video)-How to find and read a grant solicitation-How to maintain research integrity and avoid misconduct-*

Discussion Panel: How to develop a research agenda-How to manage and use grant money. These sessions are open to all CPHS faculty.

DISC Leadership Style Assessment: In this workshop, faculty will learn about the unique skills and attributes they bring to the classroom by taking the DISC Leadership Assessment. Participants will learn how to apply their unique personality strengths towards their approach to collaboration, teaching, research and service.
