## CAMPUS CRIME ALERT

January 28, 2009

### Aggravated Robbery

**DATE(S):** January 28, 2009 **TIME(S):** 1:30 a.m.

**OFFENSE:** Aggravated Robbery

**LOCATION:** Greystone Apartments (3600 Rosewood Street)

On Wednesday, January 28, 2009, at approximately 1:30a.m., two unknown masked suspects entered a Greystone Apartment and demanded money and personal property from the occupants. The suspects were reported to be armed and dangerous. The Complainants were ordered to empty their pockets and get down on the floor. The suspects escaped with an undisclosed amount of cash and property.

The Complainants described the suspects as follows:

- African American male last seen wearing all black clothing with a dark colored bandana covering his face and a multi-colored baseball cap.
- African American male, light skin complexion, last seen wearing a black long sleeved shirt, green hood and a black knit stocking cap covering his face.

#### **SAFETY TIPS:**

Confrontations can occur without provocation, through no fault of your own. When such confrontations do occur, there are some actions you can take.

- **BE ALERT!!**
- Always lock all your doors and windows when you leave the house/apartment or late hours at night (even those on upper floors).
- Remain as calm as possible. This will not be easy if you are confronted, but it is your first step towards an escape. Your own initiative and clear thinking are your best defenses.
- Report the incident. Call the police immediately and report what has happened. If you call from an "on-campus" land-line telephone, dial 7000. If you are calling from an "off-campus" or cell phone, dial (713)313-7000 or 911.
- Try to notice details. This can allow you to provide the police with detailed physical and clothing descriptions of the person(s) involved.
- Keep a list of serial and model numbers for your electronics, and other property items.
- If a vehicle is involved, try to note the vehicle's license plate number or the vehicle's manufacturer, model and color or any other identifying features.
