## CAMPUS CRIME ALERT

June 8, 2009

### ARRESTED

**Suspect was arrested at the scene. This is an ongoing investigation, with other persons of interest.**

**DATE(S):** June 3, 2009 **TIME(S):** 8:30 p.m.

**OFFENSE:** Burglary of a building

**LOCATION:** Barbara Jordan Mickey Leland Building, 3100 Cleburne, Houston Harris County.

An unidentified black male suspect was observed via video CCTV monitors, pulling on doors on the third floor of the Barbara Jordan Mickey Leland building. The suspect entered a classroom on the fourth floor.

Once the suspect entered the classroom, he stood on top of a table, attempting to cut the wires connected to a projector. The projector was unscrewed from the ceiling and hanging by two wires, when a Texas Southern University Police Officer arrived and the suspect was arrested.

#### SAFETY TIPS:

Confrontations can occur without provocation, through no fault of your own. When such confrontations do occur, there are some actions you can take.

- **BE ALERT!! Be Cautious of your surroundings.**
- Do not walk alone during late night/early morning hours.
- Be aware of suspicious person(s) and/or irregular behavior.
- Remain as calm as possible. This will not be easy if you are confronted, but it is your first step towards an escape. Your own initiative and clear thinking are your best defenses.
- Report the incident. Call the police immediately and report what has happened. If you call from an "on-campus" land-line telephone, dial 7000. If you are calling from an "off-campus" or cell phone, dial (713)313-7000 or 911.
- Try to notice details. This can allow you to provide the police with detailed physical and clothing descriptions of the person(s) involved.
- If a vehicle is involved, try to note the vehicle's license plate number or the vehicle's manufacturer, model and color or any other identifying features.
