Burglary of a Building

DATE(S): August 27, 2009 **TIME(S):** 4:20a.m.

OFFENSE: Burglary of a Building

LOCATION(S): Martin Luther King Building

On Thursday, August 27, 2009 at approximately 4:20a.m., Texas Southern University Police Officers responded to the Martin Luther King Building for a report of Burglary of a Building. It was discovered that two unknown black male suspect(s) burglarized an administrative office, vending machine, and stole a large flat screen television. The suspect(s) also caused damages to state to property. The TSU Police searched the area for suspects with negative results. This case is currently being investigated by Texas Southern University Criminal Investigations Division.

The two suspects are described as follows:

- African American male last seen wearing black baseball cap, a black jacket with hood, red and black shorts and a pair of black Nike with white Nike emblem tennis shoes.
- African American male suspect last seen wearing a gray baseball cap, a gray jacket with hood and a pair

SAFETY TIPS:

Confrontations can occur without provocation, through no fault of your own. When such confrontations do occur, there are some actions you can take.

- Always lock all doors and windows when you leave the office/house/apartment (even those on upper floors).
- Keep a list of serial and model numbers for your electronics, and other items.
- Make sure that you pick-up your mail and newspapers on a daily basis. If you're not going to be at home for a few days or longer, arrange to have someone you trust pick-up your mail and newspapers every day.
- Do not hide a key outside of your home, because criminals know all the places that you can think of to hide it.
- When you go on vacation, make sure your home does not look like you're out of town. For example, keep your car in the driveway and your lawn mowed while you're traveling.
- Report the incident. Call the police immediately and report what has happened. If you call from an "on-campus" land-line telephone, dial 7000. If you are calling from an "off-campus" or cell phone, dial (713)313-7000 or 911.
