### Burglary of a Building

**DATE(S):** April 13, 2009 **TIME(S):** 8:50 a.m.

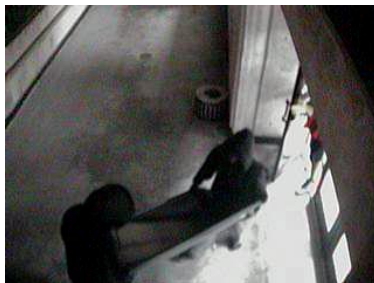
**OFFENSE:** Burglary of a Building

**LOCATION(S):** Sterling Life Student Center

On Monday, April 13, 2009 at approximately 8:50a.m., Texas Southern University Police officers were dispatched to the Student Sterling Center for a report of Burglary of a Building. The reportee stated that unknown suspect(s) burglarized the game room. The reportee stated the suspect(s) stole a flat screen television and caused damages to property.

The four suspects are described as follows:

- Two unknown African American male suspects last seen wearing dark hooded sweatshirts and sweatpants.
- Two unknown African American male suspects last seen wearing red t-shirts and shorts.

#### SAFETY TIPS:

Confrontations can occur without provocation, through no fault of your own. When such confrontations do occur, there are some actions you can take.

- Always lock all your doors and windows when you leave the house/apartment (even those on upper floors).
- Keep a list of serial and model numbers for your electronics, and other items.
- Make sure that you pick-up your mail and newspapers on a daily basis. If you're not going to be at home for a few days or longer, arrange to have someone you trust pick-up your mail and newspapers every day.

- Do not hide a key outside of your home, because criminals know all the places that you can think of to hide it.
- Keep any ladders locked up so they can't be used by burglars.
- When you go on vacation, make sure your home does not look like you're out of town. For example, keep your car in the driveway and your lawn mowed while you're traveling.
- Report the incident. Call the police immediately and report what has happened. If you call from an "on-campus" land-line telephone, dial 7000. If you are calling from an "off-campus" or cell phone, dial (713)313-7000 or 911.
