Sexual Assault

DATE(S): May 17, 2009 **TIME(S):** 2:45 am

OFFENSE: Sexual Assault

LOCATION: Campus Residential Complex, Texas Southern University, Houston Harris County.

On Sunday, May 17, 2009 a female TSU student reported that a known male TSU student was visiting her at her residence on (May 17, 2009) The female Student alleges during the visit she was sexually assaulted by this known male suspect. TSU Police are actively investigating the allegations.

The suspect is described as follows:

- African American male.
- 22 years of age
- 5'7"
- 160 lbs
- Brown hair
- Brown eyes

SAFETY TIPS:

Confrontations can occur without provocation, through no fault of your own. When such confrontations do occur, there are some actions you can take.

- **BE ALERT!! Be Cautious of your surroundings.**
- Do not walk alone during late night/early morning hours.
- Be aware of suspicious person(s) and/or irregular behavior.
- Remain as calm as possible. This will not be easy if you are confronted, but it is your first step towards an escape. Your own initiative and clear thinking are your best defenses.
- Report the incident. Call the police immediately and report what has happened. If you call from an "on-campus" land-line telephone, dial 7000. If you are calling from an "off-campus" or cell phone, dial (713)313-7000 or 911.
- Try to notice details. This can allow you to provide the police with detailed physical and clothing descriptions of the person(s) involved.
- If a vehicle is involved, try to note the vehicle's license plate number or the vehicle's manufacturer, model and color or any other identifying features.
