Remon Green named Executive Director of Public Safety/Chief of Police at Texas Southern University



Texas Southern University announced **Remon Green** as the new Executive Director of Public Safety and Chief of Police at Texas Southern University. Green, a veteran police officer of 22 years, brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to the institution where he's served in several capacities. Working his way through the ranks, Green has been at the university for nearly 14 years - first as Sergeant, then promoted to Lieutenant, followed by a promotion to Captain, and more recently serving as Deputy Chief.

The announcement was made by Edward Craig Ness, Vice President of Administration and Finance, who states, "Chief Green has served as the Interim Chief of Police since November. His enthusiasm and allegiance to TSU and our students is evident and I look forward to working with him."

About the appointment, Green states: "I can't tell you how thrilled I am to serve as Chief of Police at Texas Southern University. I want to let TSU and the community know that I will do my very best, day in and day out to serve, protect and promote the university."

For the past 4 years, Snowden has served as Assistant Dean of Student Programs and External Affairs for the Barbara Jordan-Mickey Leland School of Public Affairs. Snowden previously served the Barbara Jordan Mickey Leland School of Public Affairs as Director of Programs and as an adjunct professor.

The announcement was made by Eva Pickens, TSU's Vice President of University Advancement, who states, "Mr. Snowden brings a wealth of knowledge, relationships and corporate experience to this position. His vision to grow the development, fundraising and foundation efforts for the University are aligned with University Advancement's mission of providing Texas Southern students with access to a top rated education."

Green further noted that he plans to work in concert with the TSU community to build a safe environment for our students, faculty and staff to live, learn and work.

Green received a Bachelor's Degree in Business from Concordia University, a Master's Degree in Business Administration from the University of Phoenix, and a Graduate Certificate in Criminal Justice Education from the University of Virginia. He is currently pursuing a Doctor of Philosophy in Administration of Justice from Texas Southern University where he has completed all required coursework. Additionally, he is a graduate of the Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas Leadership Command College, Class #58; Federal Bureau of Investigation National Academy, 237th Session; Police Executive Research Forum's Senior Management Institute for Police Executives, Class #55; and a host of other leadership and command level training.

Tigers push win streak to nine games, Lady Tigers rebound after loss



Texas Southern's men's basketball team remained unbeaten in Southwestern Athletic Conference play holding on to a 75-72 road victory over Alabama State January 30.

Derrick Griffin, last week's SWAC Men's Basketball Player of the Week, picked up his ninth double-double and sixth in league play scoring 19 points with 15 rebounds and four blocked shots for the Tigers.

TSU led by six points with 29 seconds to go, but after a layup and a TSU turnover Alabama St. nailed a 3-pointer to draw Alabama State to within one, 73-72, with 15 seconds remaining.

The Hornets put David Blanks on the line, and he made a pair to make it a three point game. On the next possession, Steve Rogers missed a three pointer and Corvon Butler grabbed the rebound for ASU, but his follow-up was blocked by Griffin as the Hornets ran out of time.

The Lady Tigers' 21 game conference winning streak ended January 30, versus Alabama St. on the road.

Keiana Vines had a double-double for TSU, providing 12 points and 10 rebounds. Toni Cheadle scored 16 points while Brianna Sidney added 10 points.

On Monday, the Tigers remained unbeaten in league play with a with a 71-66 victory over Alabama A&M. The Lady Tigers got back to their winning ways with a 57-38 thumping over Alabama A&M. Up next for the Tigers is a road game versus rival Prairie View A&M.

Griffin tabbed SWAC Player of the Week



Texas Southern forward **Derrick Griffin** has been named Southwestern Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week.

Against Mississippi Valley State Griffin scored 16 points, grabbed 17 rebounds, blocked six shots, handed out four assist, and nabbed one steal playing in all 40 minutes of the contest.

Griffin earned his eighth double-double of the year and fifth in a row when he posted 13 points and 13 rebounds against Arkansas-Pine Bluff Monday night at home.

The two sport student-athlete is third on the team in scoring averaging 12.7 points per game and 10.1 rebounds per outing. Griffin has played in a total of 13 basketball games this season as he competed on the football team this past fall.
