WELCOME TO THE STUDENT HEALTH CENTER!

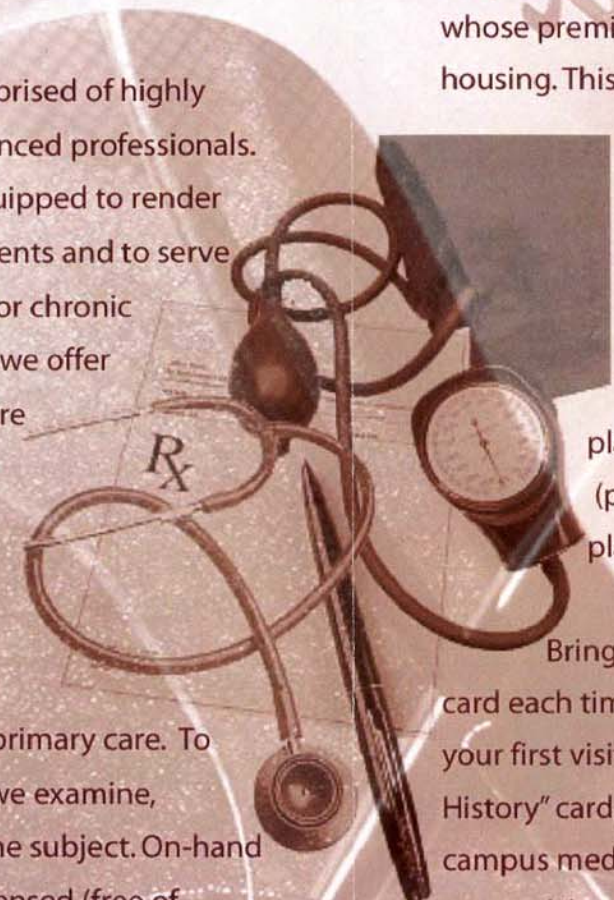
The **Student Health Center** is located behind the Lanier East dormitory, next to Parking Lot D.

Our Center is comprised of highly qualified and experienced professionals. It is designed and equipped to render service for acute ailments and to serve as a resource center for chronic illnesses. In addition, we offer information, healthcare literature, and health counseling to aid in preventive medicine.

Our objective is to serve as a facility for primary care. To reach this objective, we examine, diagnose, and treat the subject. On-hand medications are dispensed (free of charge) to students, (faculty and staff to a lesser degree). Specific medication, not available from the Center, may be obtained from any pharmacy with a prescription written by the University Physician.

Students who reside in University Housing are provided a basic hospitalization/accident insurance plan whose premium is included in the cost of housing. This plan is also available (for a fee) to students who do not reside in University Housing. Cost is low and coverage is minimum. Therefore, it is recommended that all students supplement this plan with additional insurance (personal, family plan, work-place, etc).

Bring your validated student I.D. card each time you visit the Center. On your first visit, you will complete a "Medical History" card. This card will be your on-campus medical record. On each subsequent visit, your diagnosis and treatment will be charted on this card. Your **Student Health Center** record is confidential. No one can get information from your medical record without your written consent or a court ordered subpoena.
