












**STUDENT ENROLLMENT: GENDER BY LEVEL**


**Figure 5.1 Undergraduate**




**Figure 5.2 Master's**


**Figure 5.4 Professional**




**STUDENT ENROLLMENT: ETHNICITY BY LEVEL**




**Figure 5.6 Fall 2013**




**Figure 5.8 Fall 2013**








**Figure 5.10 Fall 2013**






**Figure 10.1**


**Figure 10.2**


**Figure 10.3**
