






**Figure 5.1 Undergraduate**




**Figure 5.2 Master's**


**Figure 5.4 Professional**




**STUDENT ENROLLMENT: ETHNICITY BY LEVEL

**Figure 5.5 Fall 2010**




**Figure 5.6 Fall 2014**




**Figure 5.8 Fall 2014**





**Figure 5.9 Fall 2010**




**Figure 5.10 Fall 2014**


